

Charitable Donations

Your HRKC is a 501(c)(4) non-profit organization. According to our Bylaws, no profit or remainder of dues may benefit any member or individual. But, we are able to donate to charities.

Last year, after a thorough review of our finances, the HRKC Board of Directors elected to donate \$2,000 to 4 charitable organizations. At the October membership meeting, members in attendance voted to donate \$2,000 to the Sequim Police K-9 Program, Port Angeles Police K-9 Program, Peninsula Pet Emergency Group, and the AKC Canine Health Foundation.

These donations were made possible by you and the countless hours you devoted to our AKC canine events in 2025.

The Club presented a check to the Peninsula Pet Emergency Group at the Annual Meeting/Christmas Party in December. This organization is an independently-owned and operated, single doctor emergency service. Dr. Amanda Mason has collaborated with Dr. Linda Allen of Pacific Northwest Veterinary Hospital, and utilizing her hospital space provides emergency after-hours services to our community. They were honored to receive it and look forward to serving the community.



It took us a while to catch up to the K-9 groups, but we finally did. They attended our February meeting. And, it was amazing! Accepting the donations were: Sequim PD K-9 Officer Taran Johnson with K-9 Dutch, Sequim Police Chief Mike Hill, Port Angeles PD K-9 Officer Whitney Fairbanks with K-9 Copper

Police K-9 teams are highly trained working units that assist in suspect apprehension, tracking, narcotics detection, evidence searches, and community outreach. These dogs and their handlers undergo extensive training and ongoing certification to ensure they are prepared to serve and protect our communities safely and effectively.

K-9 programs are often supported in part by donations. Funds help with the purchase of K-9 dogs, specialized training, equipment, and medical care throughout the dog's working life.
